

Safe Migration and Labour Rights for Ethiopian migrant domestic workers

Webinar on the research carried out on Ethiopian migrant domestic workers (MDW) towards Lebanon, looking at irregular migration, working problems in Lebanon, remittances, returns and reintegration issues. The findings of the research will be discussed by relevant stakeholders, focussing on the need to recognise labour rights of MDW and to set up safe migration corridors as foreseen in the 10.7 target of SDGs, in the Global Compact on Migration and in the new bilateral agreements signed by the Ethiopian government with some destination countries. A specific attention will be devoted to the debate on the role of Development cooperation in the management of migration flows.
